1. What subjects we are offering (registration only have arabic)

Answer: We will teach two main subjects in sha Allah. Arabic and Bengali.

2. Every class is 30 minutes with very young kids, how will you make sure all the kids of different ages will understand?

Answer: In a 30-minute class with very young kids of varying age levels, it is essential to implement strategies that foster understanding for all. Using age-appropriate language and explanations helps ensure that concepts are accessible and comprehensible to each child. Integrating visual aids and interactive activities engages their senses and keeps them actively involved in the learning process. Encouraging peer-to-peer learning and cooperation promotes a collaborative environment where older children can assist younger ones, reinforcing their own understanding while helping their peers. Adapting teaching styles to accommodate individual needs ensures that every child receives the necessary support and challenges to grasp the material effectively.

Additionally, providing clear and concise instructions helps maintain focus and comprehension throughout the short duration of the class. By implying these methods, educators can create an inclusive and dynamic learning environment that caters to the diverse needs and developmental stages of each child.

## 3. Do you think a 30-minute class is enough for young kids?

**Answer:** Absolutely, a 30-minute class can be beneficial for young kids as it keeps their attention focused and engaged on specific activities, ensuring efficient learning and retention. It also allows the kids and teachers interactions throughout the day more frequent and productive, enhancing their overall learning experience.

**Answer:** Two levels. One for beginners, one for the advanced who will do Hifz.

For Bengali our focus is reading, writing and speaking. We will start from the basics and group the students according to their levels.

**Answer:** Prior to the Arabic classes, expert teachers will do oral assessments and divide students into two groups based on their proficiency: beginners for those with little or no prior knowledge, and advanced for those with higher reciting skills with proper tajweed.

13. Do you provide exams after completing the syllabus?

**Answer:** In a multi-grade classroom, it's common to have a continuous assessment approach rather than a year-end exam for all. The evaluation process can include quizzes, projects, presentations, and periodic assessments tailored to individual grade levels and learning

progress. This approach ensures ongoing learning and allows teachers to monitor each student's development effectively.

14. Would you be able to mention how many semesters will cover until summer?

**Answer:** The program is not structured into specific semesters, and learning will be tailored to each child's pace. However, certain activities or courses may be considered summative assessments. The number of activities or courses until summer may vary depending on individual progress, but the focus is on continuous learning and personalized development rather than fixed semester timelines.

15. Could we know about the whole year course plan and evaluation method?
